[The Word] is a discerner of the thoughts and intents of the heart. And there is no creature hidden from His sight, but all things are naked and open to the eyes of Him to whom we must give an account.

h. A ______ – Psalm 147:15

He sends out His command to the earth; His Word runs very swiftly.
